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

I was reading AVweb the other day and saw an article about Cirrus reducing their work week from 4 days to 3 days because of the reduced demand for their aircraft. The article went on to state that "In September, Cirrus laid off 100 staff in Duluth and at its composites parts plant in Grand Forks, N.D." and that "Business is off about 10 percent at Cirrus, and the General Aviation Manufacturers Association reported that, overall, sales of piston aircraft were down 16 percent in the first half of 2008."

proposed requirement that all aircraft have the new 406 MHz ELT to fly in their airspace as of Feb. 1, 2009. This will most likely reduce the number of US GA flights into Canada as the FAA does not require US aircraft to have the 406 ELT. Both have recommended that pilots be allowed to substitute a 406 MHz PLB for the expensive ELT.
