An RV-7 With Attitude

Our September program highlighted an RV-7 built by chapter member Bob Cartwright. Bob built his beautiful aircraft over an eight year period starting in 2003 with completion in 2011. He just recently retrieved the plane from the paint shop. The RV-7 you



remember, is an all around sports plane with great cross country capability. It can hold two FAA



standard pilots, 100 lbs. of baggage, and 42 gallons of fuel. Bob's RV-7 is equipped with a

180 hp engine using electronic ignition and automotive plugs. Top speed is probably well over 200 mph. Bob says he now has over

100 hours in the aircraft and is still learning how to fly it since it is so markedly different from his previous aircraft, which was a Navion. As you can see, the cockpit is very well equipped and the overall aircraft reminds me of a slogan used on an old TV program, "have gun will travel". I know Bob is proud of his accomplishment, and he should be.

Kitplanes Editor Paul Dye became the first journalist to fly the new Panther single seat sport plane this week in Florida. The cleansheet design from Sport Performance LLC is in the process of being kitted, and the company reports that they have several on order and a number of builders already working on their tail kits. The prototype is flying with a Corvair engine, specially modified for aviation use, and gathered significant interest at Airventure 2013.

"The airplane flies very well, and I felt at home doing rolls and other mild aerobatics within the first half hour in the airplane" Dye said. "For a prototype with only about 60 hours of flight time, the design feels and looks very mature and is an impressive achievement at the less expensive end of the market. The cockpit was comfortable, the controls responsive, and it didn't appear to have any bad habits on take-off or landing."
