#### What Will ADS-B Do For Me?

Kevin Faris gave the members a look at an important piece of the FAA's NextGen technology, ADS-B (Automatic Dependent Surveillance-Broadcast. ADS-B is the glue used to transform air traffic control from the current radar based system to a satellite based system. ADS-B uses GPS signals along



with aircraft avionics to transmit the aircrafts location to ground receivers. The ground receivers then transmit that information to controller screens and cockpit displays on aircraft equipped with ADS-B avionics.

ADS-B will allow pilots to see what controllers see; other aircraft in the sky around them. Pilots are also able to see and avoid bad weather and terrain. Temporary flight restrictions can also be received.

The improved accuracy, integrity, and reliability of satellite signals over radar means controllers will be able to safely reduce the mandatory separation between

aircraft. ADS-B will provide greater coverage, since ADS-B ground stations are so much easier to place than radar. Remote areas without radar coverage, like the Gulf of Mexico and parts of Alaska, are now covered by ADS-B.

ADS-B is projected to cost approximately 40 billion although the GOA sees the

costs being much higher. Full ADS-B implementation is scheduled for 2025 with 2020 being the deadline for having the required avionics installed in the civil aircraft fleet. There is a wealth of information on the FAA website about the requirements, cost, current status of implementation, etc. Lots of reading material.
