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Working the Bugs Out

I'm beginning to learn about owning a home built aircraft. Just a little. For instance: I thought once the plane was built and running, it would get easier. Well, it has..... but.....

I had been experiencing rough run-up on one mag (E-mag) on my RV-7A once in a while. I assumed it was me not leaning on the ground and getting the plugs wet. It seemed if I ran it lean for a bit, things cleared up. After my last trip back to my parents, I did an in-flight test of the mags. Wow. That got my attention. Something was not right. On the left mag, the engine would intermittently spit and sputter and scare the heck out of me. On the ground at Millard, I did an extensive run-up and decided I had no idea what was happening. I installed new plugs and nothing seemed to change. I was grounded.

After several run-ups, followed by discussions with the vendor on their way to Sun-n-Fun, I pulled the mag and sent it in for repair. They didn't find anything, sent it back with new plug wires. Ran differently, but not correct. This time I swapped mags and isolated the problem to the mag and not the wiring or anything else. After sending them back a second time, they replaced the coil. Supposedly they couldn't find anything wrong again, but replaced the coil and sent a circuit board back in the box in the event the coil was not the issue. It ran GREAT! I have only ran it up prior to rain rolling in and then have had two short flights, but it is nice to be back in the air after 3 weeks of going around with the vendor. It appears everything is being taken care of under warranty.

So..... Hopefully there aren't too many bugs left. There's 113 hours on the Hobbs, but the work is worth it!

Tom Mann had an excellent presentation on fiberglass construction and various methods for getting a light-weight yet strong layup. I always find it always enlightening to watch how someone who knows what they're doing completes a project after I've already made random attempts myself. Now, to make my go-fast sub-cowl out of fiberglass.....

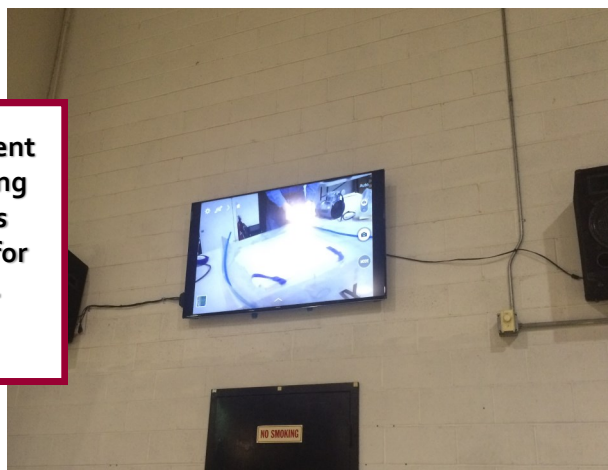
after hours.
