November Meeting Minutes

The November chapter meeting was held on 11/14 at Oracle Aviation in Millard. The meeting was called to order at 7 PM by President Chris Halfman.

Meeting minutes: The minutes of the October meeting were approved as published in the newsletter.

Treasurer's report: Bob Cartwright reported a current balance of \$14,198.29, including the final tally of \$2840.51 income from the Trimotor event. Excluding the Trimotor income, we're within \$.18 of last year.

Membership: Jerry Ronk reported 122 members. Remember that your \$25.00 2017 dues are due in January.

Tech Counselor: Mike Howard showed his new self-built tool for holding screws and nuts in hard to reach locations. Mike also discussed the failure of his Odyssey PC680 battery in his RV-12, which turned out to be a failed internal inter-cell connection.

Young Eagles: Chris H. reported that four pilots flew 15 Young Eagles on Oct. 15.

Tools: Jerry Ronk reported that the scales are in use, but all tools are accounted for.

Builder reports: Tom Mann reported that another member not in attendance has flown his Velocity for the first time and will likely bring it down to a meeting in the spring. Bill Haas reports that the hydraulics on his Berkut are finished, and the fuselage is off the table and has gear attached. Jerry Ronk reported that he cut the back off his Sonerai fuselage. Chris Halfman showed pictures of his (partially) painted RV-7A. Also, there is no builders meeting scheduled for November or December due to the holidays.

Flyouts: Mike Howard reported two flyouts. One was to Anita, IA for lunch, with 8 planes and 10 people. There were also 8 planes for a trip to Stearman Field in KS for lunch. There is a planned trip to Lawrence, KS some time in December.

Social Coordinator: Chris Beran reported on plans for the holiday party on 12/9 (see following article).

Old business: Mike Howard reported that if a scholarship is awarded through IWCC, we would lose any control over the scholarship. Efforts are under way to talk to UNO and IWCC to have candidates send applications directly to EAA 80. The discussion involved a deadline for application (Feb. 1) and a date to award the scholarship (probably August). A motion was passed to award two, \$1,000 scholarships to aviation program students in their sophomore or later year in 2017.
