Meeting Minutes

September 2018

The chapter meeting was held on September 10th at Millard Airport, Oracle Aviation. The meeting was called to order at 7 PM by President Chris Halfman.

There were no new members or guests present.

Meeting Minutes: The August 2018 meeting minutes were approved as published.

Treasurer's Report: The September treasurer's report was approved as published. Chapter expenses totaled \$4.95. Ending balance \$16,023.26.

Membership: Bob Condrey reported 115 members (26 have not paid their 2018 dues). Bob has a list of members (18) who have not provided their EAA National membership number and he would like these members to provide this information.

Tech Counselors: Mike Howard looked at Bruce Mundie's Nieuport 28, which subsequently performed engine runs and taxi tests.

Young Eagles: The YE rally at Plattsmouth on September 9th resulted in 26 YE's flown. The next rally (KMLE) is scheduled for October 13th. There was a brief discussion that perhaps some of the YE money should be spent on folding tables.

Tools: Jerry Ronk reported that the aircraft weighing scales were with Bruce Mundie and then will be used by Bob Condrey. Bob Condrey used the chapter trailer to move his RV-10 to the hangar. The new trailer floor (wood shrinkage) had numerous loose carriage bolts (which Bob tightened), one cross member board missing, and one ramp missing. Bob donated two aluminum ramps for the trailer.

Builder Reports:

* Bruce Mundie and Bob Condrey have arranged for a DAR to inspect their aircraft in late September. The DAR is charging \$300 per aircraft, plus they will split the travel expenses for the DAR.

* Bob Condrey moved his RV-10 to a Millard hangar.

* Bruce Mundie performed an engine run and taxi testing with the Nieuport.

Builders Meeting: None scheduled.

Fly-outs: Mike Howard reported that four aircraft (5 pilots) flew to Albany Mo for (a good) lunch. On 9/11 he plans to fly out to Ames Iowa.

Social Coordinator: The chapter picnic was held at Kevin Farris' hangar. The grill worked well for the picnic. In a couple of months the grill will need to be moved somewhere while Kevin's hangar is relocated to a new pad. After cleaning the grill it should be evaluated whether it continues to be acceptable, or perhaps needs to be replaced. At the picnic, Sue Mundie volunteered to organize the chapter Christmas party – targeting January. Chris was glad someone volunteered to take this on, more information to follow.

Old Business:

1) 501c(3) proposal. Bruce Mundie received a check from Bob Cartwright and will be submitting the long form 501c(3) application for approval.

2) EAA Chapter 80 sign. Josh Tocko was not present, deferred to next month.

3) Microphone. Ed Kirker was not present, deferred to next month.

4) Scholarships. Mike Howard sent a notice of our scholarship availability to the UNO staff. The deadline for applications is December 1st, with the scholarship awarded early next year.

New Business:

1) October is nomination month for Chapter 80 officers.

2) The movement to obtain a chapter hanger at Millard through Oracle was shot down by the Omaha Airport Authority. There was further discussion on hangars and chapter (stuff) consolidation, but nothing resolved or motioned. prizes were presented to those who answered correctly!
