Young Eagles will also be flown during STEM day, September 24 at Oracle Aviation, Millard.



August 2022

The chapter meeting was held on August 8th at the Millard Airport, Oracle Aviation, and called to order at 7 PM by Bruce Mundie.

Guests and New Members: Approximately 50 members in attendance. Guests included Sherry and Jim from Omaha.They live with their grandsons that had flown with Young Eagles and just wanted to check out our chapter.

Meeting Minutes: The July 2022 minutes

- Mike Howard stated that while at Oshkosh he spoke with Zenith and they reported that there have been two failures of the fiberglass doors. The doors have been redesigned to use aluminum frames. New doors have been ordered and have arrived.
- He discussed rivet and bolt lengths, how to inspect for correct length by the extension or recession of the mandrels (for pull rivets), and that solid rivets should stick through the material by 1-1/2 diameters and then when squeezed properly showing ½ the diameter in length.

Announcements:

- Jim Beyer reported that at Oshkosh 2022 we had our first chapter campsite. Six sites at \$270 per site.He'd like to do it again next year and would like to start discussing it in March and have a list of participants by May.
- Bob Condrey reported that AirVenture 2022 had record participation of 650,000+.The last record was 642,000 in 2019.
- Presentation: Greer Dave had an unclassified presentation on his flying the E3 AWACS. This aircraft, derived from the Boeing 707-320B airframe, first flew in the early 1970's. It has a gross weight of 320,000 lb and fly's typical missions of 8.5 hrs at 350kts using up to 15 degrees of bank, and orbiting at FL290-310 with refueling capability. The USAF air originally had 31 aircraft built and has lost two in accidents.Other AWACS countries flying the E3 include the UK, France,

NATO, Saudi Arabia and Japan (767 w/E3 equipment).

Well, AV22 is a wrap and I am finally home in Florida for a few days of rest. I'd like to reflect on my experiences this year. Hope it is not too boring to any of you. AirVenture is

so huge; it is not uncommon to not see any friends there even though in attendance. I did get to see many of you at the 186 breakfast get-together on Tuesday at what is now called the "Roxy," but used to be the "Aces" cafeteria. Saw Judy Sparks, Tim Lewis, Chuck Kyle, Jim Stone, the Pastusiks, and may others.

Actually, I spent most of my week just to the south of the cafeteria at the Builder Education Center (BEC) in Class Room B, assisting in the Composite 101 classes, twice a day at 0830 and 1300, but I am getting ahead of myself. Let's go back to the beginning.

About two months ago in correspondence with an old friend in England, he commented that he was going to the Meaux Airshow in France. I jokingly suggested that if he wanted to go to an airshow, he should come to the biggest one in the world, Oshkosh AirVenture. A couple of days later, my friend, Graham, emailed that he was coming! I have known Graham since the 80's when he was part of the marketing team for British Aerospace trying to get the Navy to buy the Hawk for what became the T-45 program. After retirement, he managed the Trust for the preservation of many of the airfields involved in the Battle of Brittan. A few months ago, Graham flew a Spitfire! The Wednesday before leaving for AV22, I picked up Graham in Venice, FL in the Mooney and flew him back to Spruce Creek. On Friday we flew the

Mooney to Culpepper and spent a night with Dave Watrous. On Saturday, Graham and I flew to Fon du Lac WI (FDL) while Dave W. flew with Scott Vanderveen, Bill Posnett, and Dave Baden in Scott's Lance to Waukegan, IL (UGN). Scott has a hangar and car at UGN. I dislike the delays associated with flying into and out of OSH, and FDL is a very easy alternative. We all rendezvoused at the Wisconsin University dorms where EAA had rooms for us.

Having a strong aviation background and having never been to AV, it was really interesting to see Graham's reaction to AV. To put it in perspective, the "big" airshow at Meaux lasted one day, attracted 32,000 fans, had 75 planes, and 210 volunteers, compared to AV22 lasting seven days, attracting 650,000 fans, 14,000 planes, and over 5,000 volunteers!

To me, the most fun at AV is to be a volunteer. I worked in the BEC helping with Composite 101, gave a two-day SportAir Workshop, and presented three Forums. I look forward to returning each year to renew friendships with fellow volunteers. My first AV was in 1973, so next year will be fifty years. Not fifty years of volunteering, I started that after about 10 years, and I have missed a few. Came the summer after I returned from Viet Nam, where I was flying the A-6 off the Enterprise. Had the definite feeling that the Ripon arrival was slightly more dangerous that going to downtown Hanoi!



Here is a picture of most of our team in the Composites 101 Presentation. The guy in the grey shirt is Scott Vanderveen from New Jersey, who is the presenter for the class. First guy on the left in the blue shirt is Lance Zellers, currently living on the FL west coast, and former Ch186 president and former EAA Board Member (back when Paul was eased into retirement). The lady lives in Titusville, not far from me (by coincidence) and the short guy in the black hat's home escapes me. Graham from England is immediately behind me, and the rest are mostly from the DC/Pax River area. Dave Maitland helped us several days, but was not there the day of the picture. We worked hard Saturday setting up all the supplies for the classes. We ended up having over 600 attendees, so we cut out at least 1200 pieces of fiberglass, 600 polyurethane foam cores with sanded feathered edges, and 600 each, cups of epoxy and resin! Wes setup for about 50 projects for each class, and then cleaned up the epoxy messes after. We also organized 70 chairs in place of the 18 work tables for the lunch time lectures and swapped them back for the 1300 class. All told, we had over 1000 people attend our classes. Great fun.

Sunday Watrous and I flew back to Culpepper and the other four, including Graham, flew to St. Marys (Pax), Doylestown (to drop off Graham with another old friend) and finally back to Sky Manor (Scott's home base). Mon, Tue, and Wed I stayed with Watrous and did three annuals on friend's planes. Thursday, I flew home, exactly 14 days after departing. Got 20.1 hours on the Mooney and have many lifetime memories. What could be better?

Keep building, flying, maintaining, learning and having fun.
