Tech Counselor Bob Condrey

It's the time of year when we get a constant reminder that we live in the Midwest and it's winter. Great time to do maintenance on our airplanes, but it seems that somebody always leaves the freezer door open at the airport! Here's a solution that works reasonably well that I've used a few times. Build a small frame (wood, PVC works well) and then cover with sheet plastic. You can then use a low power, oil filled space heater in that enclosed space. There's no open flame or other ignition source, and this style heater uses less power than the small cube style electric heaters. Putting some foam pads on the concrete also helps a lot. The "heat hut" pictured was able to keep the work area at almost 60 degrees!

EAA Chapter 80 Meeting Minutes

January 2023

The chapter meeting was held on January 9th at ABLE ACE, Oak View Mall, and called to order at 7 PM by Bruce Mundie.

- Guests and New Members: Five guests attended: Bob Rayborn (not a pilot, interested in aviation); Jeff (CAF), Joe Nemick,, and Keith & Linda Hugo (Mooney owner, flies Sovereign).
- **Meeting Minutes:** There were no minutes and no meeting in December to approve.
- **Treasurer's Report:** The December treasurer's report was provided in the chapter newsletter and approved. The opening balance was \$10,536.49. The ending balance is \$10,062.91. Chapter

Scholarship:

- Cole Dostal is the new scholarship chairman (absent).
- Bruce Mundie will be handling the Ray scholarships.
- Delaney, 2022 Ray scholarship recipient, reported not flying much lately, but is preparing for her written exam on January 21st.
- **Tech Counselors:** No tech counselors present. Jim Beyer reported that the Aviation Nation RV-12 has now flown 700 hours (800 hours on the engine). The Rotax gearbox was torn down and no internal gears were serviceable - the repair was costly. Excessive running time at 2000 rpm at ground idle is attributed to the gear issue. The ground procedures have been changed to not wait for the engine to warm up at idle before taxiing. Idle will now be at a better (less vibration) idle speed of 2500 rpm and the pilot is to ensure the engine is warmed up prior to takeoff (versus taxi).

Along the way he got involved in the Commemorative Air Force and worked his way up from flying Champs to the T-6, and ultimately to the P51. He first soloed the P51 in 2003, started aerobatics and formation flying in the T-6, and now flies the T-6 and P51 in surface waivered airshows. He is also qualified flying the F4U Corsair and the Grumman F8F Bearcat. They start their P51 Florida tour in February with the rest of the year's schedule to be announced soon. Rides on the P51 are available for purchase.
