## → Koehler's Korner→



I have had a couple of calls this month on what value to torque various hardware items on our planes. Here are two easy sources, The Lycoming Direct Drive Overhaul

Manual and Advisory Circular 43.13-1B. There are many other sources, such as Mechanic Handbooks and various other manufacturers' manuals, but almost all of us will have AC43.13 or a Lycoming OH Manual. If you don't have these documents, free copies of both can easily be found on the internet.

One note of caution is needed here. Be sure to check the appropriate manufacturer's manual or kit manufacturers' manuals for recommended torque values. They should be used first and may be significantly different than the "book" values listed here for any of a variety of very valid engineering reasons.

So, here is the torque table from AC 43.13:

{Ed. I could insert the torque table here but you wouldn't be able to read it because the print shrinks too much. That said, if you want to see the table, go to AC-43.13B, dated 9/8/98, paragraph 7-43 Engine Bolts, Table 7-1. page 7-9.}

Note that it is broken down into fine thread (most of our AN type hardware) and course thread (often on engines and some accessories), and further separated into standard and shear nuts (thin for bolts only loaded in shear, like on a clevis). Shear nuts are much thinner than regular nuts. Note also that this table is for dry (not lubricated) threads that have been plated with cadmium for corrosion resistance (usually a pale golden color).

The torque tables in the Lycoming OH Manual cover several other items beyond just bolts, such as pipe (NPT) threaded fittings, crush washers, hose and tubing B-nuts, and studs. Note also that the threads are to be lubricated, not dry. Common lubricant can be most anything from engine oil to hydraulic fluid to WD-40!

{Ed. I could insert the Lycoming torque table here but you wouldn't be able to read it because the print shrinks too much. That said, if you want to see the table, go to Lycoming Service Table of Limits and Torque Value Recommendations, SSP-1776- 5-PT1, page 1-41.}

Notice that a torque wrench, properly calibrated and compensated for any extensions used, is needed to properly use these tables, except for the use of crush

washers. They are installed by a certain number of degrees of rotation after the sealing surfaces are in contact. I have seen them reused and tightened down to a thin wafer, definitely not a good practice. I try to keep the common use sizes on hand so that a fresh washer can be used whenever I need one for such items as the suction screen on the Lycoming oil sump, which should be cleaned every oil change.

I hope this little discussion on hardware torque values better build and maintain your plane and keep it in tip top shape.

Keep building, flying, and maintaining.
