## → Koehler's Korner →



I have finally gotten a TruTrak (Aero Cruze 100) autopilot for my Mooney after a four-year wait! Actually, I got two and first installed one on a friend's Mooney, and then

having practiced on his, am doing mine. I'll go into more detail perhaps next month, but part of installing all the newer, modern, avionics displays and systems involve providing pitot and static air pressure inputs, which we will chat about this month.

On my Mooney, in its early days it had a pitot input to the airspeed indicator and a static

input also to the airspeed, plus the altimeter and rate of climb indicators.

Then I added a mode C encoder and it needed a static input. Next, I added an altitude hold feature to my Brittian autopilot system and had to splice in a pitot input. Next. when I added ADS-B it required an external activation switch so that it would change power levels from low to high at about 40 knots, so another tap-in to the pitot and static systems was required. Then things got busy with the replacement of the vacuum attitude indicator with an all-electronic display (weighing 1/5 the weight) from uAvionics which also required both static and pitot inputs. Finally, the new autopilot control and display also requires both a pitot and static input. A look behind the left side of my panel shows the myriad of tubing to support these, with the autopilot box in the middle having attachment nipples and tubing connected.

If you install any modern displays, such as the Garmin G3X or G5, expect to have to make pitot and static connections.



There are several fitting systems one can use to connect the tubing in your aircraft. Most aircraft use a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " OD plastic tubing, usually either Nylaflow or Poly-Flow. I prefer the Poly-Flow in that it is generally cheaper and rated to a higher pressure (up to 1200 psi). Think in terms of about  $50 \phi/ft$ .

Fittings for this tubing come in plastic and brass. I prefer the brass ones that are referred to in the Aircraft Spruce catalog as

Brass Poly-Flo Fittings. In other places on the internet, I have found them listed as Parker Poly-Flow Fittings. There will be a three-digit number to designate what the fitting is, such as 268P-04X02 for a male connector having the ¼" tubing on one end and 1/8" pipe threads to screw into the back of the instrument/display. Another example of a commonly used fitting is a union tee having three tube connections for splicing into an existing system, such as 263P-04 for a Union Tee in ¼" tube.

Note that this type fitting has an inner brass sleeve to hold the tubing open while the plastic compression sleeve squeezes the tubing from the outside as the nut is tightened. By-the-way, the proper connection torque is to tighten the nut and sleeve to finger tight and then tighten ¼ turn with a proper wrench. For the ¼" tubing we use, the compression nuts need a 7/16" wrench and the body of the Tee can usually just be held with your fingers (unless you are over torquing the nut) or it can be held with a 5/16" open end wrench. The following picture shows the tubing, some fittings and the wrenches needed. There is a short piece of tubing on the Tee to show how



it fits over the inner brass support tube.

The usual problem with connecting this tubing is that ultimately you'll have to do some of the fittings behind the panel. As seen in the first photo, getting access is often the greatest challenge. Plan your hook-ups accordingly. Do the hard attachments prior to mounting the components, and, hopefully, all that are left will be relatively easy access.

Hope this little discussion helps you build, maintain, and upgrade your bird.

Keep building, flying, and maintaining.
