

CherryMax Rivets

The use of commercial pulled rivets in experimental aircraft is widespread and those aircraft are designed with those fasteners in mind. Occasionally the need arises when the strength of a driven rivet is required but access for bucking the shop head isn't available. CherryMax rivets to the rescue! With a few exceptions, CherryMax rivets are acceptable to substitute for driven rivets. Note that the company "Cherry" actually manufactures several different types of rivets but only the CherryMax and CherryLock series are suitable as substitutions for driven rivets. These are very sophisticated when compared with commercial pulled rivets. What makes them special is that they incorporate a locking mechanism for the mandrel instead of just depending on friction. For that to work, the rivet has to be pulled properly and fully set! Trying to "cheat" and pull at an angle will cause the stem to break early, the rivet won't be fully set and the locking feature won't engage. To tell if it's properly set, look at the factory head after the stem breaks. The end of the stem must be very close to the surface of the rivet body (yes, there's a spec for that). These rivets also come in a variety of grip lengths and it's critical that the proper grip length is chosen or again, the stem won't break at the appropriate time and the rivet won't function as designed. One other interesting point – the packaging on these rivets has an expiration date! That date is really all about the lubricant on the mandrel drying out. If that happens, it's likely that the rivet won't set properly. You can however "recondition" them. Just tap the mandrel out, put a drop of oil on the shop head end of the mandrel and then tap the mandrel back in place. One final note – Cherry makes a relatively inexpensive tool for installing these and it works well. You can however use a standard rivet puller but be aware that CherryMax rivet stems will quickly wear down the tool's jaws. I'd also avoid the use of a non-Cherry pneumatic or electric rivet puller. My experience has been that more often than not they don't tend to properly set CherryMax rivets. Bottom line: these rivets work very well when installed properly but they're expensive. Current price for the 1/8" diameter versions ranges from \$.63 to \$2.80 each depending on grip length! -Bob Condrey
